PIN. AUCTION 2021 - ART KISSES AWAKE

Our theme this year "Art Kisses awake" was born out of a long period of isolation and silence - much like the prince magically woke Sleeping Beauty up from her spell, let's awake art with a loving kiss! After last year's great success, we are going to hold a hybrid auction this time: As internet live stream, which art lovers can follow from all over the world, and live on site at the rotunda of Pinakothek der Moderne. Just like last time, contributing artists and galleries will receive a share in the profits.

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY AND INNOVATIVE PROJECTS

The pandemic has changed the world. Issues that art and culture must take on have come to the fore; issues like identity, diversity and digitalization, and no museum acting in the presence can ignore these urgent matters. Institutions





need to undertake self assessment and have to face critical questions – not an easy task in times with means barely sufficient to keep the doors open.

As public institutions, the Pinakothek der Moderne and the Museum Brandhorst assume social responsibility and react to social change. It is PIN. 's heartfelt concern to pursue this goal. Our association provides financial aid for innovative projects. Without the PIN. Auction many exhibition concepts and educational projects couldn't have been realized at all. A prime example of our activity is the exhibition "Who's next? Homelessness, Architecture and Cities" (Museum of Architecture, TUM) which addresses social and political approaches to homelessness between denial and suppression and presents architectural concepts from various countries that try to offer solutions.

Another socially highly relevant and forward-looking exhibition like "**AI Robotics. Design**" (Die Neue Sammlung - The Design Museum) covers both hopes and challenges that artificial intelligence (AI) and digital progress bring along for our present and future life. The exhibition was conceived in cooperation with Prof. Sami Haddadin, one the leading experts in the field of AI. Such a collaboration delivers proof of the currently prevailing interdisciplinary concept of art and shows the relevance museums have in our society.

Additionally, PIN. supports **exhibition- and educational projects** at the Pinakothek der Moderne and the Museum Brandhorst that put special focus on formats particularly suitable for children. Among them we also find an initiative of The Design Museum dedicated to **barrier-free access and inclusion** with the aim of opening up to a group of visitors that has not received much consideration yet.
